Church Charitable Giving during December

The Charity Plate donations during December will, of course, be given to Ripple Africa (see below).

The Collection Plate cash collection taken during the December services will be donated to the following charities:

Carol Service, 13th December: Barnabas Fund supports projects which help Christians where they suffer discrimination, oppression and persecution as a consequence of their faith

Midnight Mass, 24th December: Al Basma Special Rehabilitation Centre, East of Bethlehem, is a place where young adults with learning disabilities can go during the day for training in valuable life and work skills

Christmas Day, 25th December: The Children's Society which fights child poverty and neglect, and helps all children have a better chance in life.

Advent Carols Collection: Thank you for supporting the work of the Romanian Foyer Trust (a charity run by the Fairfax-Cholmeley family). The collection from the Advent Carol Service and the profits from the Advent supper held on Sunday 29th November will be donated to the Romanian Foyer Trust to support vulnerable young adults as they set out in the world after a life spent in institutions.

Remembrance Day Service: We would like to let people know that a donation was made to the British Legion and to the "Combat Stress" charity, following our Service on 8th November.

Charity of the Quarter

For November/December/January, the PCC has chosen Ripple Africa (www.rippleafrica.org) as our charity.

RIPPLE Africa is a charity working in Malawi. It was started by Geoff and Liz Furber in 2003 and now has over 150 Malawian staff. The charity works with local communities in the Nkhata Bay District which has a population of 250,000.

Providing a hand UP and not a hand out, Ripple Africa runs 8 pre-schools, supports 5 primary schools and has built a secondary school. It has also built, and runs a community library and offers adult literacy.

With the large population, there is tremendous pressure on the natural resources. They have a number of innovative and exciting environmental community projects. In forestry conservation they are conserving 150 km² of forest, and have helped communities plant 4 million trees. The charity's fish conservation project is already

showing positive results. They are working with 40,000 households to provide special fuel efficient cook stoves which together save 80,000 bundles of wood every week and are much safer for women and children.

The charity has built and supports a local dispensary and runs a local disabilities rehabilitation programme.

In addition they have many overseas volunteers who get involved.

Charlie Knight (Hill Farm Lane) has worked in Malawi for this charity and will be coming to tell us about it at a service in the new year.
