Charity of the Quarter

For November/December/January, we will again be supporting Ripple Africa (www.rippleafrica.org).

RIPPLE Africa is a charity working in Malawi. It was started by Geoff and Liz Furber in 2003 and now has over 145 Malawian staff. The charity works with local communities in the Nkhata Bay District which has a population of 250,000.

RIPPLE Africa's projects are based around the rural village of Mwaya in the Nkhata Bay District of Malawi. The charity's overriding aim is to empower communities so they themselves can achieve a sustainable future – we strongly believe that it is the local people who are the solution to many of the challenges they face. We do many things in a small area, as many different issues are closely linked. Everything RIPPLE Africa does is in response to the local communities' needs. By enabling the local communities, great things can happen and they are all life changing. RIPPLE Africa's belief is "Providing a hand UP and not a hand out," and that philosophy has been central to the charity's ideology for over a decade.

- **We work closely with the local communities, Chiefs, and District government departments**, empowering local communities to be the solution.

- **We have 145 Malawian staff and 3,550 volunteers working on our projects.**
