**Is your child 3 or 4 years old?** Primary school place – you must apply now

If your child was born on or between 1 September 2014 and 31 August 2015, you need to apply for a primary school place now. You must still apply even if your child already attends a nursery attached to the school.

Full details of the process are on the County Council website.

Deadline for applications is **15 January 2019**.

**Flu Jabs** We have been asked to urge all residents to get their annual flu jab soon. The virus strikes in winter and can be more serious than you think – it can lead to complications such as bronchitis and pneumonia and can be deadly.

Immunisation is free for those who:

- Are over 65
- Are pregnant
- Have certain long-term health conditions such as severe asthma, chronic heart disease, kidney or liver disease and diabetes
- Are aged 2-3 (not usually an injection, just a quick and easy nasal spray)
