History of Duns Tew

Duns Tew is a village about 10 miles south of Banbury in North Oxfordshire. With nearby Great Tew and Little Tew, Duns Tew is one of the three villages known collectively as "The Tews".




The centre of Duns Tew is designated an area of special architectural and historic interest to be preserved and enhanced.

The origins of the village name would seem to date back to Anglo-Saxon times, where a "Tiewe" described a ridge of land, or meeting point of two different types of soil. Duns Tew is situated on the North Aston fault, separating clay in the north from limestone & sand to the south.

Duns Tew can be found in the Domesday Book of 1086 – a copy of the entry can be found in the church. At this time the population of the village numbered 53. This has fluctuated over the centuries, reaching a low of 14 after the Black Death. Today, by comparison, Duns Tew has a population of just over 500.







Planning Committee

Duns Tew has a separate planning committee (Councillors David Jackson (chair), Tom Lindley, Harriet Stapleton and Juliet Semple) which meets monthly, depending on the requirement to review applications. All applications are reviewed by the current parish councillors and only if they object to the plans will a planning meeting be called.

Planning Decisions

Planning decisions are made by Cherwell District Council and **NOT** the Parish Council. The Duns Tew Parish Council only make a representation to the planning department after assessing the individual planning proposal.

The Cherwell Local Plan 2011-2031 Part 1 was formally adopted by Cherwell District Council on 20th July 2015.

The Plan provides the strategic planning policy framework and sets out strategic site allocations for the District to 2031. Now adopted, the Plan forms part of the statutory development plan and provides the basis for decisions on land use planning affecting Cherwell District

Village Services & Amenities St Mary Magdalene Church

The church of St Mary Magdalene is part of the Benefice of Westcote Barton with Steeple Barton, Sandford St Martin and Duns Tew - and since 1st March 2015, also the churches of Over Worton

and Nether Worton. It is situated in the centre of the village of Duns Tew, not far from the Village Hall, and is a much respected part of community life.

The church is built of the honey-coloured Hornton stone. The font and porch date from 1200AD and the arcade of pillars with carved heads is 14th Century. In the 19th century the interior was restored, and is almost entirely Victorian. The lychgate at the entrance to the churchyard was built to commemorate the year 2000 - it also serves the community by being a bus shelter.

Everyone is very welcome at our services. Because the five parishes (six churches) share the one Rector, the services rotate around the Benefice and times and types of services vary from week to week. At Duns Tew the pattern is as follows:

1st Sunday of the month: 6.00pm Evensong (5pm Nov-Mar)

2nd Sunday of the month: 11.00am Matins (Lay-led)

3rd Sunday of the month: 9.30am Eucharist (contemporary language),

followed by coffee.

4th Sunday of the month: 11am Eucharist (traditional language)

Special Services:

Throughout the year we hold special services at one of the churches in the Benefice, such as at Christmas and Advent, Easter, Mothering Sunday, Pet Service, Harvest, All Souls, Remembrance, and 5th Sundays of the month.



Little Tiddlers:

In addition to Sunday services there is a Benefice Pram Service for the under-5's, called "Little Tiddlers" in Middle Barton at the Alice Marshall Hall (on the crossroads of Enstone Road and Worton Road). This takes place on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of the month, at 10.30am. It is family friendly, gently structured with action songs, story, craft, drink and biscuit, and time to play. Young families from Duns Tew are very welcome.

Midweek Communion:

Midweek Communion takes place on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of the month in the home of a parishioner. On the 2nd Wednesday it is held at 15 Washington Terrace, Middle Barton, at 10.00am and on the 4th Wednesday it is held at Dinghams, Hill Farm Lane, Duns Tew, at 10.30am. All are welcome. Public Access Defibrillator





Waste & Recycling

Weekly kerbside collections

Fortnightly kerbside collection of recycling, food and garden waste and household waste occur in Duns Tew.

Collection day is **Thursday**. Ensure your bins are on the kerbside by 7am on collection day. A diary of collections can be downloaded from the Cherwell District Council website http://www.cherwell.gov.uk/recycling

Recycling and Garden waste are taken one week. Household waste the other.

We provide green rubbish bins for non-recyclable household waste. One bin per household is provided for the collection of domestic non-recyclable rubbish.

Household waste (green bins)



Everything in the green wheeled bin is taken to and ERF (Energy Recovery Facility). In order to avoid wasting precious resources and to help protect the environment, please use your green bin only for items that cannot be recycled.

- ✓ disposable nappies
- ✓ bin liners, plastic bags, cling film

Please do not put any of the following in the green bin:

- X Food waste
- X Hazardous waste, such as paint
- X Items that can be recycled (this includes electrical items)
- X Garden waste
- X Hot ash (it can damage the bin)
- Aerosols or pressurised containers Image depicting Batteries and Small electrical items
- X Batteries and Small electrical items



Food and Garden waste (Brown bins and Kitchen Caddy)



All food and garden waste is collected and taken to a local composting facility in Oxfordshire.

- ✓ food waste cooked and uncooked
- ✓ prunings branches up to 2cm in diameter
- ✓ pet straw and sawdust
- ✓ grass cuttings

What stays out of the brown bin:

- ➤ plastic of any kind, including bin liners, plastic bags and cling film
- × animal waste
- ★ soil, bricks, rubble and ash
- general household waste (including nappies)

Kitchen caddies (brown)

Residents can use a small kitchen caddy to collect all the leftover food, peelings and other food waste. All food waste, cooked and uncooked can go into the caddy, and you can use compostable liners or newspaper to line the caddy. Or you can put the food waste in loose. Once your caddy is full it can all go into the brown bin along with your garden waste.

Recycling Bins and Boxes (blue)



It is not essential to wash and squash recyclables but this will avoid the bin smelling and will give you more space. You do not have to remove labels from cans or plastic bottles.

Contents are recycled

- ✓ Paper (inc. shredded paper)
- ✓ Tins and cans
- Cardboard
- ✓ Drinks cartons
- ▼ Tin foil and foil trays
- ✓ Magazines and newspapers
- ✓ Aerosols
- Plastic bottles and containers (any hard plastic packaging, including pots, tubs and trays)

What stays out of the blue bins:

- × Glass
- X Batteries and Small electrical items
- × Textiles
- Carrier/black bags
- X Disposable nappies
- Cling film
- × Polystyrene
- X Crisp and sweet packets

Most residents have more in their blue bins, than they do in the green bin. So any extra recycling can be put out next to the blue bin, in a

clear plastic sack, or cardboard box.



Batteries and Small Electricals



Glass



Glass cannot be recycled at the kerbside in Duns Tew.

Glass bottles and jars can be recycled at one of the recycling bank sites across the district. There is a bottle bank and clothing bank in Duns Tew as you head out of the village on the Barton Road.

They can also be recycled at both Alkerton and Ardley waste and recycling centres.

Transport

Road

The A4260 runs very close to Duns Tew and links Kidlington in Oxford to the South with Banbury in the North.

The M40 motorway can be accessed at Junction 11 in Banbury, Junction 10 at Ardley and Junction 9 in Bicester.

Train

The nearest railway station is in Lower Heyford (station called Heyford). This line links Banbury and Oxford and those hubs serve many national destinations. A new station has opened and is located in Kidlington (Oxford Parkway) and provides express trains into central London.

Bus



There is no longer a bus service through Duns Tew. The S4 service which links Banbury with Oxford can be picked up on the A4260 at the end of the North Aston Road. Timetables for this service can be found at:

Our Bus is a new community led bus service which from August 2016 has operated seven routes to replace the S4C service which was withdrawn by Stagecoach in February 2016. The new service connects the villages of Middle Barton, Duns Tew, Sandford St Martin, Steeple Barton, Lower Heyford, Glympton, Wootton, Woodstock, Over Worton, Great and Little Tew with Banbury, Oxford, Oxford Parkway rail station and Chipping Norton. The service also includes health centres in Deddington and Chipping Norton and supermarkets in Chipping Norton and Kidlington.
